6th We have been working on our first chapter on Continental Drift and Plate Tectonics. Encourage your child to double-check Canvas for their nightly assignments.


9/27 First test

Language Arts with Mrs. Schafer

ELA Homework Reminders for all Middle School Students:

- Reading and writing notebooks are collected quarterly.
- * Students need to independently keep up with these each week by writing 2 pages (6-7th) or 3 pages (8th) about what they read. (I do give some class time for this).
- * Questions to guide their writing are located in the back of their notebooks (avoid just summarizing what was read).

6th This week, we dove into vocabulary literary elements such as setting and point of view for The Cay. We ended our week with Drop Everything and Read (DEAR) time and time to work in their reading and writing notebooks.

7th This week, we started with working on using context clues to determine the meaning of words within a sentence and introduced literary elements in myths. Later in the week, we reviewed these words and terms with an interactive game. The students loved the "hands on" experience and competition! Students also researched a god/goddess of their choice and created a Bio Poem about their god/goddess, decorating it with appropriate symbols. We ended the week with completing some in-class analysis activities of literary elements in myths and introducing our first writing project--Create Your Own Myth. We will be working on this project over the next two weeks.

8th This week completed Chapters 1-3 of Touching Spirit Bear. Students are doing very well with their critical thinking and making connections! We finished the week with having Drop Everything and Read (DEAR) time and time to work on their reading and writing notebook.



Social Studies with Mr. Baxter

6th This week we discussed the theme of place and how it gives personality to the 5 Themes of Geography. We also discussed the theme of Region and how geographers can categorize a location by regions.

Today, we celebrated Constitution Day! The goal of the lesson was to illustrate the structure, function and powers of the government in the United States as established in Articles I, II and III of the U.S. Constitution.

Next week: We will discuss Human Interaction and Environment and the theme of Movement. Look for homework reviewing these topics on Tuesday, and Thursday next week. I will always be sending a study guide for home early next week.

September 29th: First Test (tentative)

7th We are currently learning about the origins and beliefs of Christianity in World History as it pertains to the growth of the Roman Empire.

For Constitution Day, we discussed the importance of the Constitution and what it means to us. The students today were asked to make a decision to either sign or not sign the "class constitution."

Next week: We will look at the legacy of the Roman Empire and its eventual decline.

8th On Monday we started to discuss the origins of political parties in the United States. We examined how different ideologies created tensions in the early republic.

Happy Constitution Day! Today we examined the Bill of Rights and why we have them. We looked at real life examples of each of the 10 amendments and how they are so valuable to us today.

Next Week: We will discuss the presidencies of John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, we will also look at how the young nation changed and journey with Lewis and Clark as the explore the great unknown.
