6th GRADE UPDATES

Social Studies: This week, we learned about how different parts of the world have different customs and traditions. We researched different cultures to see those traditions. We also played America's favorite game show "Learning with Mr. Baxter" to review for yesterday's quiz. Next week we will discuss the different economies around the world, and how they impact our lives. We will also begin to delve into how trade works and it differs around the world.

Science: It is hard to believe that we are already a quarter of the way through the year! The sixth grade class began to learn about the different types of weathering that change the shapes of features on Earth's surface. Next week, we will move into the types of erosion, such as examples of mass movement, and wind, water, and ice. Our next test will not be until the second week of November.

ELA: This week we finished reading *The Cay* and worked more on context clues and characterization. We finished the week with completing a study guide for Chapters 10-19. Next week, we will review the answers to the study guide on Monday for the quiz on Thursday. We will also be watching the movie of *The Cay* next week and comparing it to the novel.

Math 6S: This week students wrapped up the chapter on multiplying and dividing fractions and decimals. The test for Chapter 2 will be next week. The next topic to be covered is algebraic expressions.

7th GRADE UPDATES

Social Studies: This week, the students learned about the feudal economy. We went outside on Tuesday and the students had an interactive lesson about how the feudal economy works. Science: We spent some time this week learning about the different types of chemical bonds, ionic and covalent. The kids did a great job working on some high school level chemistry, with drawing electron dot diagrams. They will be well familiar with these topics and ready for high school chemistry! Next week we will finish Chapter 3 with talking about bonds between metal atoms and then we will review and take our Chapter 3 test next Friday, Nov. 5.

ELA: This week, we worked on how to use sticky notes as a reading strategy. We focused on making connections, asking questions, and understanding point of view in *Dragonwings*. In addition, we started literature circles for chapter three. Literature circle discussions will take place on Monday for chapter three. We finished the week discussing the importance of dragons in Chinese culture. Next week, we will continue with literature circles and analyze literary elements within *Dragonwings*.

Math: This week students wrapped up Chapter 3 with a test on Thursday. The next topic is on inequalities.

Theology: This week we learned about the Cardinal virtues of Prudence, Justice, Fortitude, and Temperance. We looked at how self consciousness poses a challenge to growth, and how God does not judge us on appearance, but sees what is in our hearts. However, because of this, we can rely on the good actions of other people in our lives when we need help.

8th GRADE UPDATES

Social Studies: This week, the 8th graders presented their War of 1812 projects to their classmates. We then had fun burning the White House and some of the battlefields. I was really impressed at the creativity of the projects. They were fantastic. Later in the week we looked at how the Supreme Court strengthened the federal government during John Marshall's tenure. We also began to look at the importance of the Monroe Doctrine.

Next week we will explore more in depth the presidency of James Monroe. We will also have our first DBQ essay next week. Students will work on this in class on Thursday and Friday. A DBQ is a Document Based Question essay. Students will be given different primary sources, answer the questions about the sources then use the documents to answer an essay question.







Science: I am so proud of the work the 8th graders put in on their cell projects! There was

a ton of cake to eat and they were all delicious! I also think that the kids really became familiar with the parts of the cell and their functions, which made the test they took at the end of the week much easier to study for.

We will be moving on to more cell processes in the next chapter, such as photosynthesis and cellular respiration.

We ended the week introducing the "America and Me" Essay Contest. Next week, we will be working on our essays for the contest and continue with literature circles for *Touching Spirit Bear*.
