6th GRADE UPDATES

Social Studies: This week we looked at how Hinduism grew out of the Vedas and how Hinduism supported people and society in Ancient India. We also looked at the impact of Hinduism on India. We began to look at how Buddhism began as well. Next week we will continue to learn about the ideas of Buddhism and how they spread throughout India.

Science: We are still working on our weather chapter through this next week. We have been learning about different types of severe storms, and the students spent some time creating Google slide presentations about severe weather and how to protect oneself. Next week, we will move into how scientists make weather predictions, and how those predictions are shared using weather maps.

ELA: Grammar—This week, we continued studying pronouns, focusing intensive and reflexive pronouns. *The Giver*—This week, we finished *The Giver*. We also began reviewing concepts from the entire novel for a unit test next week. Just a reminder for students to keep up with their reading/writing notebook as the quarter progresses. (At the end of this week, students should have six weeks' worth of journaling in their notebooks.)

Math 6S: This week students learned about the coordinate plane and reflecting points in the x and y axes. Next week they will be reviewing for the Chapter 6 test.

Math 6B: This week students reviewed for the Chapter 8 Test which they will take on Monday. Next week they will start a chapter about statistical measures.

Theology: We will be finishing out the Book of Exodus this coming week by covering more about Moses on Mount Sinai and his reaction when he found the people straying from God's wishes. We will be finishing a film on Moses and the 10 Commandments next week before moving into our review for our test.

7th GRADE UPDATES

Social Studies: Next week we delved into the French and Indian War further and looked at how tensions developed between the British and the American colonies. The students are working in groups and are going to create movie trailers that will describe the French and Indian War. They will work on these next week and hopefully we can get outside to do it. We also began to look at how tensions arose between the colonists and the British. For the month of March each Wednesday we are pairing up with Mrs. Casey's 1st grade class to be their reading buddies.



Science: We reviewed for our Chapter 8 Test on heat and thermal energy this week, before taking the test on Wednesday. We then began Chapter 9, titled "Characteristics of Waves." We will be learning about what a wave is, the types of waves, as well as what happens when waves interact with one another and with other materials. This chapter gives the class a chance to play with Slinkies and demonstrate different wave properties!

ELA: Grammar—This week we focused on subject complements. We also reviewed previous concepts for a quiz students took on Tuesday. Poetry unit—This week we finished our poetry unit and reviewed for a final test. Just a reminder for students to keep up with their reading/writing notebook as the quarter progresses. (At the end of this week, students should have six weeks' worth of journaling in their notebooks)

Math 7: This week students learned about the surface area of prisms, pyramids, and cylinders. Next week they will learn about volumes of prisms and pyramids.

- Monday, March 21- Chapter 9 Quiz 1 (9.1 - 9.3)

Theology: We discussed more about the Sacraments of Confirmation, Eucharist, and Penance. We also talked about transubstantiation, which is the term we use when the substantial form of bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Christ, during the Mass. We had a quiz Wednesday and are preparing for a test which will take place next week.

8th GRADE UPDATES

Social Studies: This week we looked at the early phases of the war. We discussed how so many decisions led to the Civil War. We also discussed the Battle of Manassas. Today Mr. Mike Stritch, Mary Irwin's grandfather, brought in relics from the Civil War and gave a presentation about the Civil War. Next week we look at everyday life during the Civil War and some early battles of the war.

Science: We finished learning about homeostasis and moved into discussing muscles and bones this week. We will be continuing that over the beginning of next week, including working on a lab exploring the way muscles and bones work together. After that we will learn about the structure and function of the integumentary system.

ELA: Grammar—This week, we focused on intensive and reflexive pronouns. To Kill a Mockingbird—This week, we read through chapter 21, focusing on analyzing Atticus Finch's closing argument and the nature of the trial. Next week, we will be introducing a research project for the trial and continuing to work towards finishing the novel. Just a reminder for students to keep up with their reading/writing notebook as the quarter progresses. (At the end of this week, students should have six weeks' worth of journaling in their notebooks.)

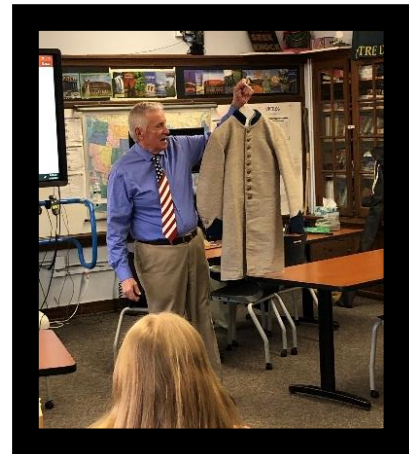
Math 8G1: This week students learned about two-way tables and data displays. Next week they will be reviewing for the Chapter 9 test.
