

6th GRADE UPDATES

This week, we went on a field trip to Greenfield Village on Monday, participated in the Saint Thomas Builder's day on Wednesday, and had MAP testing on Tuesday and Thursday.

Social Studies: This week we began to explore early China. We will examine how its geography plays a vital role in its development. Next week we will discuss the Zhou Dynasty and some of China's belief systems.



Science: MAP testing prevented us from having class a few days

this week, but we have been focusing on what causes the phases of the moon and eclipses. Next week we will be learning about the different types of tides and their causes. Our test on this chapter will be on Wednesday, May 11.

ELA 6S: We only met on Friday for regular class. We reviewed concepts for pronouns for a quiz next Wednesday. In addition, we read through Chapter 7 and completed discussion questions. If they were not completed in class, these are homework due Monday (submitted to Canvas).

ELA 6B: We read through Chapter 7 and completed vocabulary strategies for chapters 5-7, along with discussion questions and analysis questions regarding figurative language, characterization, analysis of quotations, and analysis of author's purpose.

Students need to continue working on their reading/writing notebook requirement for the 4th quarter. At the end of this week, they should have completed 3 weeks worth of entries.

Math: 6S: This week students learned about writing and graphing inequalities. Next week they will learn about solving inequalities using addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.

Math 6B: This week students learned about stem-and-leaf plots. Next week they will learn about histograms.
