## 6th GRADE UPDATES

**ELA 6G1**: This week we missed several class periods due to MAP testing. We also began daily grammar work this week. We started out with a review of nouns and focused on common, proper, concrete, and abstract nouns. In addition, we compared and contrasted the two main characters in *The Cay*, focusing on character traits, family history, and physical characteristics. We also discussed different point of view in the story and analyzed point of view in regards to the novel.



## 8th GRADE UPDATES


