### 6th GRADE UPDATES

**ELA:** This week, we began studying pronouns and their use and form in the English Language. We also looked at informational texts discussing coral reefs, hurricanes, and tornados. We practiced a variety of reading strategies for these texts and connected the information to the content of *The Cay*.

There were no reading/writing notebook requirements for this week and there will be no requirements for next week as it is a short week.

**Social studies:** This week we talked about the different empires in Sumeria. We looked at the Assyrian and Phoenician empires and how they spread their empires. Next week we will talk about the beginnings of Judaism and its effect on Mesopotamian society.

**Science:** The sixth graders have been learning about our precious resource, solid. This week, we focused on how soil is made, soil characteristics, and soil conservation. We did a lab on soil permeability where the class timed how quickly water was able to move through different soil materials. Next week, we will be moving onto erosion and deposition.

**Theology:** We took a break from the Old Testament this week to focus on the virtue of honesty. We watched the new Disney interpretation of the story of Pinnochio and used it to discuss the effects of honesty and dishonesty. Next week, we will focus on the next virtue, patriotism, and begin on the story of Noah and the Ark.
