6th GRADE UPDATES

ELA: This week, we continued discussing subjects and predicates. We will be reviewing them next week and will have a quiz on Thursday of next week. We also finished the reading/analysis portion of our short story unit this week. Therefore, we began our unit project–writing our own short stories applying the elements we have analyzed in other stories into our own writing. We are currently at the brainstorming stage of this project.

- 3rd Quarter Reading/Writing Notebook starts next week! We did not have it this week due to the end of the quarter.

Social studies: This week we talked about the Rise of Kush as an Egyptian empire. We looked at the Geography Kush and the impact that it had on the empire. Next week we will review for the test which will be on Friday January 27.

Science: We finished up our chapter on energy resources this week. We spent the majority of our time this week reviewing for our test on chapter 6 on Thursday. Then we began chapter 8, talking about Earth's atmosphere.

Theology: We have been focusing on the story of Jacob and Esau. Next we will be moving into Jacob's sons who eventually became the 12 tribes of Israel and the story of Joseph. We have also been discussing the virtue of orderliness.

Math 6G1: This week students started a chapter about polygons. They learned about the area of parallelograms. Next week they will learn about the area of triangles and will take a quiz over those concepts.

Math 6G2: This week students continued learning about converting between the customary system and the metric system. Next week they will begin reviewing for the Chapter 5 Test.

7th GRADE UPDATES

ELA: This week, we moved onto other parts of the sentence and started studying verb phrases. In addition, we read through Chapter 10 of *Dragonwings*, analyzing vocabulary, point of view, the effect of figurative language on a reader, and character motivation. Next week, we will finish analyzing literary elements in Chapter 10 and will introduce a fun project which synthesizes information learned in the text with outside sources regarding the San Francisco earthquake of 1906.

 There was no reading/writing notebook this week. 3rd Quarter Reading/Writing Notebook will start next week.

Social studies: This week we discussed the different cultures of North America and how they adapted to their surroundings. We also talked about unintended consequences of European exploration. Next week we will begin to take a look at European exploration in North America and the impact that it had.

Theology: This week we discussed the effects of Baptism. Next week we look at how the sacrament of Confirmation.

Science: We have been talking about concentration of solutions and about the characteristics of acids and bases. Next week we will be experimenting with pH paper and other indicators to identify different acids and bases. Then we will begin to review for our Chapter 5 test on the 1/30.

• Chapter 5 Test- January 30

Math 7G1: This week students started a chapter about ratios and proportions. They learned about ratios, rates and proportions. Next week they will learn writing and solving proportions.

Math 7G2: This week students took the test for Chapter 5. Next week they will start new concepts that relate to functions, both linear and nonlinear, how to write them from graphs and how to analyze and sketch them.

• Friday, January 27 - Chapter 6 Quiz 1 (6.1 - 6.3)

8th GRADE UPDATES

ELA: This week students finished their totem pole projects. They look great! We also reviewed *Red Badge of Courage* Chapters 1-2 Pre-Reading/Vocabulary activity, and we read through Chapter 2 of *The Red Badge of Courage*. Students finished the week making comic strips of the main events in chapters 1-2 in order to help them with understanding the novel. Next week, we will delve into analysis activities for the novel.

History: This week we talked about Texas Independence and the causes of the Mexican-American War. Next week we continue to talk about the war with Mexico.

Science: This week we have continued to learn about inheritance of traits in humans as well as how mutations can occur during cell replication and division. Next week we will be working on research projects on genetic disorders that we will be presenting to the class towards the end of the week and into the next.

Math: This week students took the test for Chapter 5. Next week they will start new concepts that relate to functions, both linear and nonlinear, how to write them from graphs and how to analyze and sketch them.
