## 6th GRADE UPDATES

Language Arts: We've had such a fun time getting into the swing of things in ELA thus far! We've begun studying fiction this week, with some group work prep along the way. Next week, we'll apply what we've learned about fiction and about group work to a short story called "Nadia the Willful," which students should read before Wednesday, September 6. I'm not sure about the students, but I for one am very excited to have our first grammar lesson on Tuesday!

Social Studies: It has been a great week getting to know all the students! This week they created a "getting to know me" circle map that helped me get to know them. Then we have discussed vocab and taken notes on the basics of geography, especially longitude and latitude. Next week we will continue to discuss geography and the 5 themes of geography! On Friday, September 8, the students will have their first vocab quiz.

Science: We have been focusing on the routines of the classroom and the reasons why we study science. We also have been exploring the different resources we use in the science classroom. Next week, we will be learning about lab safety and the different equipment that we use.

Theology: It was a good week as we settled into a good routine. This week we talked about scripture and tradition and its importance in the Old Testament. We had our first virtue quiz today and continued to discuss the genre of the Old Testament. Next week we will look at the genres of the Old Testament and take our first chapter test, which will be on Thursday September 7.

Math 6G1: This week students set up binders and took an IXL diagnostic test to determine their baseline. We also started working on notes and having assignments in Big Ideas Math. The topic that was covered this week was whole number operations. Next week the topics will be powers and exponents as well as order of operations.

Math 6G2: This week students set up binders and worked on the IXL diagnostic to a baseline level that they will work to improve over the course of the year. We also started working on notes and having assignments in Big Ideas Math. The topics that were covered this week were whole number operations and powers and exponents. Next week the topics will be order of operations and prime factorization.

## 7th GRADE UPDATES

The students will have their first vocab quiz on Friday, September 8.

Theology: It was good to have a somewhat normal week! We discussed the impact Jesus has on our lives. We talked about the things we can and cannot control, and the importance of Jesus throughout our lives. Next week we continue to discuss Jesus as Savior, Emmanuel and Messiah and take our first chapter test next Thursday, September 7.

Science: We have been exploring the different resources we use in the science classroom. We have also been reviewing lab safety and the CER writing method that we use in science to share our findings. Next week, we will be starting Chapter 1 in our textbook, Introduction to Matter.

Math 7G1: This week students set up binders and worked on the IXL diagnostic to a baseline level that they will work to improve over the course of the year. We also started working on notes and having assignments in Big Ideas Math. The topics that were covered this week were integers, absolute value and adding integers. Next week the topics will be subtracting and multiplying integers.
