6th GRADE UPDATES

Language Arts: We started our Business Letter writing project. Students learned about the structure of a professional business letter and outlined their ideas. We continued our discussions of *Island of the Blue Dolphins*.

Social Studies: We finished up our notes on the origins of Judaism, as well as the early history of Judaism. The students learned about how Judaism was formed, how it has changed over time, how it has impacted our society today, and how other religions connect to Judaism. Next week, we will be discussing the main beliefs of Judaism. The students will receive a study guide and will have a test on Judaism on Friday, 3/8

History and Beliefs of Judaism Test - 3/8

Science: We took our test this week on the atmosphere. This led us into Chapter 9, where we will be learning about weather. This chapter should take us right up to around spring break.

Theology: We looked at the difficulties the Israelites faced on their journey through the desert. We discussed how they faced their troubles. We also began to look at the 10 Commandments. We also had a virtue quiz on prudence. Next week, we will look at the covenant God made with the Israelites at Sinai, and we will describe the purpose of the ark of the covenant.

Language Arts: Students continued their Literature Circle discussions this week and started taking notes on research sources for the first topic in our Final Project.
