6th GRADE UPDATES

Language Arts: We finished up our Business Letter rough drafts and discussed the traits we've seen most in Karana as we near the end of *Island of the Blue Dolphins*. Our grammar lesson this week focused on sentence structure and punctuation.

Social Studies: Students started their unit on Ancient Egypt. We discussed the three Kingdoms of Ancient Egypt and the social ladder. Next week, students will get to practice and see the process of mummification on a hot dog, they will make papyrus and write their name in hieroglyphics, and they will create a pamphlet that discusses the most important pharaohs in Ancient Egypt.

Science: We have continued to learn about weather this week. We have focused on the types of precipitation and how air masses move around the atmosphere. Next week, we will be focusing on storms by creating presentations on the kinds of storms.

Theology: We looked at how the Commandments are the ultimate sign of God's love for us. We applied the Commandments to present day and are rewriting the Commandments into 6th grade language. We also had our virtue quiz on Fortitude on Thursday. Next week, we will continue to examine the Commandments and have a chapter test on Thursday, March 21.
