#### 6th GRADE UPDATES

**Language Arts:** We did an overview of the structures, characters, and stories of Greek Mythology, and compared them to the parables that Jesus taught us. Students also learned about the Greek Mythology research project, which will serve as their ELA final exam.

**Social Studies:** We continued our discussion on Ancient India. Specifically, we discussed the two big religions in India. These are Hinduism and Buddhism. Next week we will finish discussing India, and start discussing ancient Chinese dynasties.

**Science:** We have continued to learn about the sun, the moon, and Earth, and how these three bodies interact. We have focused on the phases of the moon and eclipses, and also how the moon and sun affect our tides. Next week we will finish up this chapter and review for the test on Friday.


