- Remind 101 sign up to receive school messages to your phone (instructions on page 2).
- **Big Buzz** Make sure to read through this packet thoroughly so that you are ready for the school year.

Don't be late...

School begins at 8am. Make every effort to be on time. After 8am, the administration and staff cannot be present at the gate or car line. If you are late, escort your child to the main office door. Ring the bell and your child will be admitted into the building.

...but not too early!

It is important that your student is NOT dropped off before 7:45am.

Call (616-458-4228) or email (secretary@stthomasgr.org) the school office, between 7:30-8:30am each day your child will be absent. Please leave your child's name, grade and reason for absence. Turn on Infinite Campus notifications to be notified when your child is absent.

Student drop off/pick up

Students must NEVER cross Wilcox Park Drive to enter or exit a car. For the safety of all our children, DO NOT drop off or pick up students at the curb in front of school or church. Please drop off or pick up students in the "Car Line" or "Gate Line" only.

Make sure your children know if they are "Gate Line" or "Car Line" at pickup. The Car Line is in the Church parking lot, off of Wilcox Park Drive. The Gate Line is near Children's Healing Center, off Fulton Street.

At pick up, please put your last name on your front dashboard. Treat Wilcox Park Drive as a ONE WAY street (westbound only). Use Hope Street to travel eastbound.

When exiting the parking lot, turn right onto Wilcox Park **Drive.** By creating this ONE WAY environment, we can make the beginning and end of our school days more relaxing for you and our neighbors.

Preschool parking update

For the safety of our students and school, we have added a fence/gate where the blacktop meets Grace Street. This means that our preschool parking lot is smaller this year. Please be patient as this is a temporary arrangement until we move to the Early Childhood Center next year. We ask as many P4 parents as possible to park in the Church parking lot for both drop off and pick up.

Infinite Campus information

Infinite Campus is the student management system for all diocesan Catholic schools. This online system gives parents access to student attendance, grades, lunch account balances and report cards.

Cell phone policy

Cell phones **are not allowed** in the classroom at Saint Thomas, unless permitted for assignments.

If your student needs to bring a cell phone or any other electronic personal device (including smartwatches) to school, their teacher will collect it and store it in the classroom during the entire school day.

Students who need to contact parents during the day must use the classroom or office phone. Likewise, a parent who needs to get a message to their student must call the school office and we will deliver the message.

Immunization requirements...

State Law requires that each student entering Preschool, Kindergarten or a new school have a certificate of immunization on file at the time of registration or no later than the first day of school. In addition, Preschool students are required to have a physical dated within the past two years. Please see the immunizations required for all new students, preschoolers, kindergarteners and seventh grade students. **Preschool Requirements:** Up-to-date Immunizations Record on file. Signed Physical dated within the past two years. Consent for disclosure for immunization information on file. **Kindergarten Requirements:** Up-to-date Immunizations Record on file. Vision & Hearing Screening Record on file. Consent for disclosure for immunization information on file. **New Saint Thomas students:** Up-to-date Immunizations Record on file. Consent for disclosure for immunization information on file. **All 7th Grade Students:** Up-to-date Immunizations Record. Consent for disclosure for immunization information on file.

For more information, see the <u>Vaccines required for school entry</u> and the <u>Vaccines required for child care and preschool</u> from the State of Michigan. Immunization Waiver: If you wish to obtain a non-medical religious or philosophical waiver, you must schedule an appointment at the Kent County Health Department by calling 616-632-7200.

New dental requirement...

Senate Bill 280 was signed into law in December 2023. Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, a parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis who applied to have a child registered for the first time in kindergarten or first grade in a school in Michigan must comply with the following:

- Have a dentist or dental hygienist conduct a dental oral assessment on the child not earlier than six months before the date of
 the child's registration with the school and obtain from the dentist or dental hygienist a written statement certifying that the
 child has received the dental oral assessment.
- If the parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis of the child does not meet the requirements described above, the individual must ensure that the government entity or person selected by the DHHS conducts a dental oral assessment on the child.

Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, a parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis who applies to have a child registered for the first time in kindergarten or first grade in a school in Michigan must present to school officials, at the time of registration but not later than the first day of school, one of the following:

- 1) a statement of religious exemption to the bill's requirement OR
- 2) the statement from a dental professional described above OR
- 3) a written statement indicating that the parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis will provide for the child's dental oral assessment by the DHHS's program. A child cannot be excluded from school attendance if the parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis of the child does not present a statement described above to school officials on or before the first day of school.

Required notifications...

Asbestos notification

To comply with the requirements of the EPA's Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, all of the school buildings in the Diocese of GR have been inspected for asbestos containing materials. If you would like to review the Management Plan for Saint Thomas, it is available in the school office. The Management Plan will state recommended activities which will maintain the asbestos materials in a non-friable condition. ~ Ted Coon

Pesticide notification

As a part of our pest management program, pesticides are occasionally applied. You have the right to be informed prior to any pesticide application made to the grounds or buildings. In certain emergencies, pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but notice will be following any such application.
