6th Grade Updates

ELA: We discussed the ending and theme of *The Giver* and the innate value of every human being. The students took their first grammar test of the year. We also built on our Character Analysis Essays, which will be our focus next week before we begin our poetry unit.

Social Studies: The students studied and took their Economic and Government basics test. Next week, we will be learning about the basics of history, specifically discussing primary and secondary sources, timelines, and Archeology and Anthropology.

Last day for late work: October 29

Science: We finished up 1st quarter this week by starting into Chapter 3, learning about the changes to Earth's surface caused by weathering, erosion, and deposition. Next week, we will be learning about how soil is formed and why it is so important.

Theology: We looked at the Covenant between Noah and God. We also talked about the Tower of Babel and how our pride gets in the way of us being the best versions of ourselves. Next week, we will begin to talk about Abraham and and his journey to God.

Math 6G1: Students prepared for and took a quiz over adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions and mixed numbers. Next week, they will learn about multiplying and dividing decimals.

Math 6G2: Students learned about ratios, tape diagrams and ratio tables. Next week, they will take a quiz over ratios and will learn about graphing proportional relationships.

7th Grade Updates

ELA: We had a Rumble (an in-class debate) about the morality of the two gangs in *The Outsiders*. Students also took their first grammar test. Next week, we'll jump into our poetry unit!

Social Studies: The students studied for and took their Roman Republic and Empire Tests. Then, we started discussing the beginnings of America and how people migrated to America. Next week we will look at the first civilizations in America, specifically the Olmecs, Mayans, and Aztecs.

Theology: We learned about Matthew, the Pharisees and the Temptation of Jesus in the desert. Next week, we continue to look at the Gospels as we learn about the Gospel of Luke.

Science: We began the week by finishing our review and taking the Chapter 2 test. Test corrections will be due early next week so they can make it onto the first quarter report card. Next week, we will focus on the periodic table and the ways that atoms can bond.

Math 7G1: Students learned about writing equivalent expressions and factoring and took a quiz over that material. Next week, they prepare for the Chapter 3 Test.

8th Grade Updates

ELA: We wrapped up our short story unit by looking at the purpose of literary devices and using them in our own writing. Students also finished editing the final drafts of their short stories and took our first grammar test of the year. Next week, we'll begin discussing poetry!

History: We discussed the ins and outs of the Constitutional Convention. We talked about who attended, the compromises they made, and the ideas that influenced the Constitution. Next week, we are going to discuss the Federalists vs. Anti-federalists, the Bill of Rights, and do a deep dive into the Constitution itself.

Last day for late work: October 29

Science: We finished our introduction to cells this week by sharing our cell models and then taking a test on Chapter 2. This will lead us into Chapter 3, where we will be learning about some specific cell processes: photosynthesis, cellular respiration, and cell division.

Math 8G1: Students learned about dilations, similar figures, and the area and perimeter of similar figures. Next week they will take a quiz and begin to wrap up Chapter 2.

Math 8G2: Students learned about functions, characteristics of functions, linear functions, and function notation. Next week, they will take a quiz over that material and will learn about graphing linear equations in standard form and slope-intercept form.
