March Safety and Security Update

March has been a busy month as your new Director of Safety and Security. So far, I've had the opportunity to:

- meet with a variety of school and parish staff to identify safety and security priorities.
- develop a quick reference, emergency response guide for the school and parish offices.
- work with the Technology Director to identify opportunities for new security technologies, such as cameras, access control and mass notification systems.
- perform security walkthroughs of the new ECC to identify security/safety needs.
- participate in the new School entrance relocation project.
- provide emergency response training as well as discussion scenarios for school staff meetings.
- forge new relationships with community partners, including Aquinas College, GRPD and Trinity Health.

I look forward to checking back with soon to share our progress in keeping Saint Thomas a safe place to grow in both knowledge and faith. *~Mr. Fey*

Talk 3 - Parents of sixth through eighth grade - May 19


