6th Grade Updates

ELA: Students worked in groups to outline and write their stories for the Greek Mythology Final Project; students have been working hard, collaborating well, and writing very creatively! We also took our final grammar test of the year!

Social Studies: Students wrote their opinion essays, and we began our final unit of the year on Ancient China. Next week, we will discuss Ancient China. We will particularly discuss its major dynasties, its religions, and its major accomplishments.

Science: We started Chapter 12 this week, focusing on our solar system outside of the Earth and our moon. We looked at the different models of the universe that existed over time, leading us to the current model. Next week, we will look more closely at the planets and the smaller objects in the solar system.

Theology: We learned about life after taking over Jericho this week. We discussed what type of Jeremiah needed to be and the responsibilities that the Israelites had. We also had a really good discussion about Respect this as well. Next week, we will talk about the early days of King Saul.

7th Grade Updates

ELA: Students finished their amazing dioramas and posters of the Franks' Secret Annex as we finished our reading of the play. We also kicked off our character analysis essay to identify Anne's most prominent virtues and took the last grammar test of the year!

Social Studies: This week, we discussed the start of the Revolutionary War. We discussed Lexington and Concord, the Battle of Bunker Hill, the Siege of Boston, and the book Common Sense. Next week, we will discuss the Declaration of Independence, and students will make their own personal Declaration of Independence.

• Personal Declaration of Independence - Due Saturday, May 24

Theology: The students learned about the life of Paul this week. We looked at his missionary spots, and learned some facts about them. We also took a deeper look at the virtue of Respect. Next week we will continue to look at Paul, and dive into the book of Revelation.

Science: We began Chapter 10 this week, learning about electromagnetic waves. We ended the week focusing on the different parts of the electromagnetic spectrum and their applications. Next week, we will examine wireless communication and the differences between digital and analog signals.

8th Grade Updates

ELA: Students worked hard to create the rough drafts of our Final Project slideshows. Students also took the last grammar test of their middle school careers–crazy!

History: We learned about the Civil War. We particularly discussed the Election of 1800, the North vs. the South, the important generals and women, and the first battles. Next week, we will discuss the important

battles, the medicine, and the weapons. We will also discuss the end of the Civil War. Then, students will begin their Civil War Final Project.

• Civil War Final Project - Due Tuesday, May 27 (during exam period)

Science: We continued in our unit on ecology by focusing on the movement of energy through ecosystems. We examined the different trophic roles one can play in an ecosystem. We discussed the structure of the energy pyramid, which illustrates that there is less energy available at higher trophic levels, as energy is lost as heat during each level. Next week, we focus on preparing for our final exam.

• Life Science Final Exam- Tuesday, May 27

Math 8G1 and 8G2: 8th graders will receive their exam study guides next week!

Theology: The students learned about Church History this week and we also delved into the Four Marks of the Church. We also had a really good in depth discussion about the virtue of Respect. Next week we will continue to look at Chuch History.
