6th Grade Updates

ELA: We learned about the common structures and themes of Greek myths, and began researching for our Greek Mythology final project.

Wed. May 14 - Grammar Quiz

Social Studies: We finished our unit on Ancient Greece, and started discussing Ancient India. The students learned about the Greek philosophers, as well as the wars that led to the downfall of Athens and all of Greece. Next week, we will continue discussing Ancient India, specifically the religions such as Hinduism and Buddhism. We will also learn about the empires and major rulers that existed in Ancient India, and will begin an essay on one of these rulers.

Asoka Essay: Ruthless Conqueror or Enlightened Ruler - Due Tuesday, May 13

Science: We have continued to focus on Earth's place in space and its interactions with the sun and moon. We will finish this chapter next week by learning more about our moon. Then we will review for the test at the end of the week.

Friday, May 9 - Chapter 11 Test

Theology: We continued to look at the Israelites journeying into the promised land. We read about the leadership qualities God has for Joshua and we talked about real life examples of self-control. Next week we continue looking at the fall of Jericho, and starting a new life in the promised land.

Math 6G1: Students learned about 3 dimensional figures and the surface area of prisms. Next week, students will learn about the surface area of pyramids.

Math 6G2: Students learned about adding, subtracting and multiplying integers. Next week, students will learn about dividing integers. They will also look at an introduction to statistics, including mean and the measures of center.

7th Grade Updates

ELA: We compared characters' responses to a break-in in *The Diary of Anne Frank* and learned about the Jewish feast of Hanukkah. We also began our in-class work on the Anne Frank final project, which students should also expect to work on at home.

Wed. May 14 - Grammar Quiz

Social Studies: The students took their MAP tests, and finished up their No Taxation without Representation Song Projects. They presented these on Friday. Next week, we will begin discussing the start of the Revolutionary War and how the Declaration of Independence came about.

Theology: We discussed the characteristics of the Apostles this week. We looked at each characteristic and how they related to the students. The students then examined which Apostle they are most like. Next week we will look at the conversion on Paul, and start to discuss the book of Revelation.

Science: We have finished up Chapter 9 about the properties of waves this week. Due to the field trip on Monday and MAP Testing, we will only meet twice next, so we will review on Wednesday and take the test next Friday.
