6th Grade Updates

ELA: We compared the Creation Stories of Greek Mythology with those in the book of Genesis, comparing the goodness and mercy of our God with the slothfulness and vindictiveness of Zeus. We also began outlining our Greek Mythology Final Projects.

Wednesday, May 14 - Sentences Quiz

Social Studies: The students continued to learn about Ancient India. We discussed Hinduism, Buddhism, and the major empires. Next week, we will discuss one of the most influential rulers by looking at documents. The students then will use these documents to write an essay, explaining their view on him. Then, we will begin our Ancient China unit.

Asoka Essay: Ruthless Conqueror or Enlightened Ruler, Due Friday, May 16

Science: We completed Chapter 11 this week by focusing on the properties of our moon. After reviewing, we took the test on Friday. Next week, we will begin our final chapter of new material, learning about the rest of our solar system. This material will not have its own test but will be included on the final exam at the end of the year.

Theology: We examined the Israelites' entry into the Promised Land and the capture of Jericho. We also discussed Stranger Danger and then had a great "surprise" lesson with the announcement of a new Pope. Next week, we will examine the Israelites' finally becoming a nation and the rise of Saul.

Math 6G1: Students learned about the surface area of prisms and the surface area of pyramids. Next week, they will learn about the volume of rectangular prisms.
