6th Grade

Language Arts: We discussed the importance of pain and choice and debated the morality of Jonas' community in their desire to remove these things. We also took our first grammar quiz of the year and worked on our Jonas Character Analysis essay.

Social Studies: We continued our Economics Unit. We discussed opportunity cost, demand and supply, and shortages, surplus, and equilibrium prices. Next week, we will finish our economic unit by discussing personal finances and budgeting. Then, we will start our Government Unit. We will talk about limited versus unlimited government and begin discussing the different forms of government.

Science: We have combined the evidence gathered from the theory of continental drift and seafloor spreading into the theory of Plate Tectonics. We will have our first test on Chapter 1 next week, after reviewing the material.

Wednesday, October 1- Chapter 1 Test

Theology: The students learned and explored the laws of the Old Testament. We discussed Moral, Religious, and Daily Life laws and their impact on us. Next week, we will begin discussing the Wisdom Books and their role in our lives.

Social Studies: We finished discussing the Punic Wars and began discussing how Rome changed from a Republic to an Empire. Next week, we will talk about Julius Caesar, Augustus Caesar, the rise of the Roman Empire, and Pax Romana.

Theology: The students discussed who we are and what makes us special to God. Next week, we will look at who Jesus is and the many influences he has in our lives.

Science: We began Chapter 2 this week, which focuses on the states of matter and how materials transition between them.

Math 7G1: The students took a quiz and learned about converting between fractions and decimals. Next week, they will learn about multiplying and dividing rational numbers.

Science: We reviewed and took our Chapter 1 test this week. Tests will be returned at the beginning of next week, and then students will have the opportunity to complete test corrections. We then started Chapter 2: Introduction to Cells. Part of this chapter is the students' at-home cell project. We reviewed the directions in class, and the acknowledgement slip is due back next week. The project will be due October 20.
