6th Grade

Language Arts: Students discussed the theme of *The Giver* and worked on our last body paragraphs for our Character Analysis essays. We also prepared for the test on our Noun, Pronoun, and Adjective grammar unit.

Noun, Pronoun, and Adjective Test on Wed. 10/22

Social Studies: We finished our Government Basics Unit. We discussed how the United States is a federal system of government, how the United Nations is a confederation, and the importance of citizenship and being an active citizen. The students received a study guide on Thursday and will have their Economic and Government Basics Test on Wednesday, October 22. Next week, we will review for the test and begin our Origins of Civilization Unit.

Economic and Government Basics Test - Wednesday, October 22

Science: We finished up Chapter 2 this week, learning about earthquakes. We learned how seismographs work and how past earthquake data is used to predict where future earthquakes are likely to happen. Study guides were available this week, and we will begin working on them in class on Monday for the test next Wednesday.

Theology: The students are learning the different bible genres and doing newscasts in class to explain them. They are pretty creative. Next week, we will start discussing the stories of creation.

Math 6G1: Students learned about multiplying and dividing fractions. Next week, they will learn about dividing fractions and mixed numbers. There is NO IXL for the week of October 20.

Math 6G2: Students learned dividing decimals. They prepared for a quiz. Next week, students will review for the Chapter 2 Test. They will also learn about ratios and how to use a tape diagram to solve ratio problems. There is NO IXL for the week of October 20.

Language Arts: We discussed the overall theme of *The Outsiders* and began editing our Serbs Essay final drafts. We also prepared for next week's grammar test.

Social Studies: The students read the book "Who Was Jesus?", which was taught by Ms. Lozinsky. They learned about Jesus' life and how it related to the Roman Empire. Students also received their Roman Empire study guide on Thursday. Next week, I will be back teaching, and we will finish up discussing Jesus and his life during the Roman Empire. We will then have 2 review days, and the students will take their Roman Empire test on Thursday, October 23rd. We will also begin our Early North American People unit.

Theology: We reviewed for our test which was on Thursday. Next week, we will start discussing the importance of Scripture in the New Testament.

Science: We started the week by taking the Chapter 2 test on the different states of matter. Those tests will be handed back on Monday, with corrected tests due on Wednesday. The class was given their list of elements from the Periodic Table that they are expected to memorize by the time we take the test in a few weeks. We then started Chapter 3: Atoms, Bonding, and the Periodic Table.
