6th Grade

Language Arts: Students looked back at how Jonas has grown throughout *The Giver* so far, in preparation for our discussions of the story's climax in the next two weeks. We also wrote our second body paragraph of our Character Analysis Essays about Jonas and continued our grammar unit on Nouns, Pronouns, and Adjectives.

Social Studies: We finished our economics unit. We discussed different types of economic systems and discussed personal finances. We particularly talked about how to save and budget. Then, we started our government unit, which we will continue next week. Next week, students will study different forms of Government and create a slideshow discussing a specific form of government. Lastly, we will also discuss the difference between a unitary, confederal, and federal government.

Forms of Government Slides - Due Wednesday, October 8

Science: We began the week by reviewing for the Chapter 1 test that we took on Wednesday. Those tests will be returned next week, and test corrections will be available two days after that. We ended the week by moving into Chapter 2, which builds on Chapter 1, but focuses on earthquakes.

Theology: We began discussing the Wisdom Books in the Bible. We talked about what their purpose is and tied them into the virtue of Loyalty. Next week, we talk about the prophetic books and look at the message behind them.

Language Arts: We discussed the climax of *The Outsiders*, focusing on our characters' emotional responses to struggle and on the negative impacts of stereotyping. We also wrapped up the rough drafts of our Serba Scholarship Essays and continued on in our grammar unit on Nouns, Pronouns, and Adjectives.

Social Studies: We talked about the fall of the Roman Republic and the beginning of the Roman Empire. We specifically discuss Julius Caesar, Augustus Caesar, and Pax Romana. Next week, we will discuss why the Roman Empire ended or fell. We will look at primary sources that discuss the issues that Rome had. Then, we will begin discussing Christianity in Rome.

Theology: We had a good week discussing who Jesus is, and then we looked at different Bible stories to reinforce the different images of Jesus. Next week we look at the scriptures and their importance.

Science: We have been talking about the states of matter and the factors that cause materials to transition between these different states. At the end of the week, we began to focus specifically on the gas laws that have been established to explain the relationship between temperature, volume, and pressure in gases.

8th Grade

Language Arts: We learned about mood in literature through our reading of "Tell-Tale Heart." Students identified tools that authors use to create mood and created mood themselves with our Mood Mad Libs activity! We also wrapped up rough drafts of our Short Stories and continued our grammar unit on Nouns, Pronouns, and Adjectives.

History: We began our Constitution unit. We began by discussing why the Articles of Confederation failed, as well as the positive aspects it introduced. We discussed the Northwest Ordinance, Shay's rebellion, which officially caused the revision of the A.O.C, and the Constitutional Convention. Next week, the students will learn about the Great Compromise, the Three-Fifths Compromise, and the ideas that formed the Constitution.

Science: We spent this week focusing on how the invention of the microscope led to the development of the Cell Theory, explaining the relationship between cells and living things. We then focused on identifying the microscope parts and learned how to use them. We also spent a class period exploring the use of microscopes and examining various prepared slides. Next week, we will continue to practice microscope use and then look at the organelles that make up plant and animal cells.

Math 8G1: Students learned about dilations and similar figures. Next week, students will learn about the perimeters and areas of similar figures.
