6th Grade

Language Arts: We learned how to write a limerick this week, and students wrote two of their own humorous limericks about Christmas gifts and presents! We also continued our verb unit by learning about some special verb tenses.

Social Studies: We finished the first part of our Origins of Civilizations unit. We discussed the change from the Paleolithic Era to the Neolithic Era. Students also were given a study guide, and they will have their Early Humans test next Tuesday. Next week, we will continue the second part of our Origins of Civilization unit by discussing how farming helped to build the first cities.

Science: We finished learning about weathering and moved into the other parts of the process, erosion and deposition, and how they help to shape the surface of the earth, through picking up those sediments and moving them to new places. Social Studies: We continued our Early Native American People's unit. We discussed the rise and fall of the Aztecs and the Incas. Next week, we will continue to discuss the rise and fall of the Incas. Then, we will talk about early North American people and the different regions that they lived in.

Theology: We continued to digest the book of Matthew. We took notes and discussed the first half. Next week we will look at the second half of the gospel

8th Grade

Language Arts: We analyzed a beautiful poem by Gwendolyn Brooks, "Speech to the Young," which encourages us to find joy and live in the moment. Students also practiced citing sources for our Poet Biography project; this is an important life skill, and they did a great job!

History: We finished our Constitution unit. Students took their test on the Constitution. Then, we began our George Washington unit. We discussed Hamilton Versus Jefferson, and the precedents that George Washington set in place. Next week, we will continue to discuss Hamilton. We will talk about his financial plan, the First National Bank, and the Whiskey Rebellion. Then, we will do a class simulation where students will get a role and tell me how that role would react to Hamilton's financial plan.

Science: We reviewed this week and took the Chapter 3 test on the cell processes of photosynthesis, cellular respiration, and cell division. Next week, we will be starting Chapter 4, which will be an introduction to heredity and genetics.

Math 8G1: Students learned about the slope of a line and graphing proportional relationships. Next week they will learn about writing and graphing linear equations in slope-intercept form and graphing equations in standard form.
